## CO-REC, WOMEN'S & MEN'S LEAGUES

### Divisions, Dates & League Fee

Many teams play all four seasons of the year and we are expecting over 350 teams to play this fall. Our Women's and Men's Leagues play under the same fair-play rules and management as our Co-Rec Leagues. This summer our Men's League had eight divisions (55 teams), our Women's League had three divisions (20 teams), and our Co-Rec Leagues had 45 divisions (287 teams). The total number of teams for Summer '10 was 362. The Women's and Men's Leagues play mostly on Tuesdays and weekends. The Co-Rec divisions are offered every day of the week. ### Nets Included

Co-Rec Soccer provides nets and our referees mount them at the fields when needed as a service to the teams and managers.

### Association Rules

1. Co-Rec teams of 11 players may have a maximum of six women or six men on the field.
2. Shinpads are not required. Our rules state that kicking other players while "going for the ball" is a foul.
3. Referees wear black, so no black or dark conflicting jerseys please.
4. Co-Rec Soccer reserves the right to edit team names.

## STREET SOCCER SEATTLE FORMS STARS

Street Soccer Seattle (SSS), whose goal is to cultivate a sense of community for youth in transition, through organized soccer, has fielded it's first team, Stars.

After taking our Experimental College class (see Page 2), team manager and president of SSS, David Nibley, combined a few adult player / coaches with eight young homeless, or immigrant and refugee players from Honduras, Eritrea, the Congo, Somalia, Mexico and various states across the USA and registered for play. Currently, Stars are 1-1-0 in Men's League Division 6.

With support from the SeaTac Park Department and player-placement assistance from Co-Rec Soccer staff during clinics (see below), SeaTac FC started up in the spring in WN Div 8E, finishing with a 3-7-0 record. This summer they are performing well in WN Div 7C, 2-1-0.

### SATURDAY CLINIC & PLAYER-PLACEMENT GAMES

Co-Rec Soccer offers a drop-in clinic and game every Saturday of the year, rain or shine! League orientation, individual coaching and drills begin at 11 a.m. followed by a full-field refereed game. Register at the field at 10:45 a.m. with Co-Rec Soccer staff.

Beginning and experienced players are welcome. We coordinate up to 360 teams per season (many play year-round) in up to 60 divisions. Players meet staff and team managers, and may be placed onto existing or new teams. Teenagers may participate for free through Summer 2010.

**DAY: Every Saturday of the year! Wear red or white.**

**TIME: 11 a.m. - 1 p.m., Coaching, drills and scrimmage.**

**FEE: \$20 for any four Saturdays in '10. Register at the field. The first 20 SeaTac residents (10 men / 10 women) interested in forming a team are free. Co-Rec Soccer managers are also free.**

### CO-REC TEAMS FORMING THRU SIX-WEEK CLASS

Never played before, or haven't played in years? Great! Co-Rec Soccer is offering a six-week class on Thursdays and Saturdays for beginning or experienced players who would like to create a Co-Rec (co-ed) team.

You will learn the Association's Reckless-Play Rules (designed to lower the risk of injury), develop individual skills, and play in scrimmages. The classes include coaching, offensive and defensive strategies, and team development. The teams will join the Winter '11 Season and play all four seasons of the year!

### CO-REC SOCCER MISSION STATEMENT

The Co-Rec Soccer Association is for women and men who welcome the challenge of fair-play rules that encourage finesse, skill and strategy over brute force. In 1982, we began by coaching nine players who enjoyed our style of soccer. We now manage as many as 7,000 people (up to 360 teams per season) every week of the year.

Whether it's for the recreation and exercise, or for the opportunity to compete with other top players in greater Seattle, one of our approximately 60 divisions will fit the needs of your team. We also provide schedules customized around specific requests. Our proofreading method has resulted in every team being sent to the right field at the right time in all of our games (over 130,000) since we began in 1982.

Co-Rec Soccer employs four office staff and 60 referees. Potential referees are evaluated by senior refs who accompany them during tryout games. Referees are then monitored from the input of team managers on evaluation forms. Our referee confirmation system has resulted in an excellent referees' attendance record.

Also, our referees call in the score and game reports after each game. This helps us identify players who repeatedly receive cards for rough play. Unsportsmanlike or reckless players, players who give false I.D. to the referee, and players committing fouls that result in serious injuries risk being suspended for four weeks or more, or expelled from the Association without a refund. Players who fight or threaten the referee may receive a one-year minimum suspension. Please read our Reckless-Play Rules and discuss them with your teammates before registering your team.

### REFEREES WANTED

Experienced players or referees who are willing to enforce Co-Rec Soccer's Reckless-Play Rules may apply now. Weekly Saturday tryouts are held at casual games in a supportive atmosphere. \$44 for a single game and \$73 for two games, paid every two weeks. Call (206) 329-1548 for more information.
